



**THE CROCHET
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3-ROUND GRANNY SQUARE

Notes:

1. This granny square can be made with any weight yarn or crochet thread and the appropriate size of crochet hook to go with your yarn/thread selection.
2. You may wish to make many of these granny squares and join them together to form something larger, like a scarf, afghan, etc.
3. You can make these squares with any colors you desire, too. Have fun!!!

One-Colored Granny Square



Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 4, 2 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped chs count as first dc), ch 3, (3 dc in same ch, ch 3) 3 times; join with sl st in 4th ch of beg ch-4: 4 groups of 3 dc and 4 corner ch-3 sps.

Pull on tail in center of granny square to tighten first chain and to close center hole. If your first chain won't tighten to close the center hole, then you've made your slip knot incorrectly. For instructions on how to make a slip knot, please check out my tutorial here:

Rnd 2: Sl st in next 2 dc and in corner ch-3 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, ch 1; *(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3: 8 groups of 3 dc, 4 corner ch-3 sps and 4 ch-1 sps.



3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; *(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3: 12 groups of 3 dc, 4 corner ch-3 sps and 8 ch-1 sps.

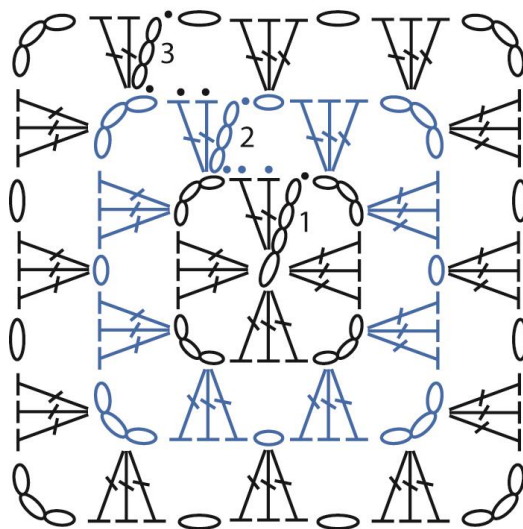
Finish off, leaving a long tail to join granny square motif to other motifs (or weave in tail on wrong side). Weave center tail through base of dc on Rnd 1 (on wrong side of granny square) to further close hole in center and to weave in this end.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next 2 dc and in corner ch-3 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, ch 1,

Here is the symbol chart for the One-Colored 3-Round Granny Square, for those of you who love crochet symbols, like me:

3-Colored Granny Square

Rnd 1: With first color, work same as Rnd 1 of One-Colored Granny Square. At end of rnd, finish off first color; weave in ends.

Rnd 2: With right side facing, join 2nd color with sl st in any corner ch-3 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, ch 1; *(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3: 8 groups of 3 dc, 4 corner ch-3 sps and 4 ch-1 sps. Finish off 2nd color; weave in ends.

Rnd 3: With right side facing, join 3rd color with sl st in any corner ch-3 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; *(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3: 12 groups of 3 dc, 4 corner ch-3 sps and 8 ch-1 sps. Finish off 3rd color; weave in ends (or leave a long tail for sewing squares together).
